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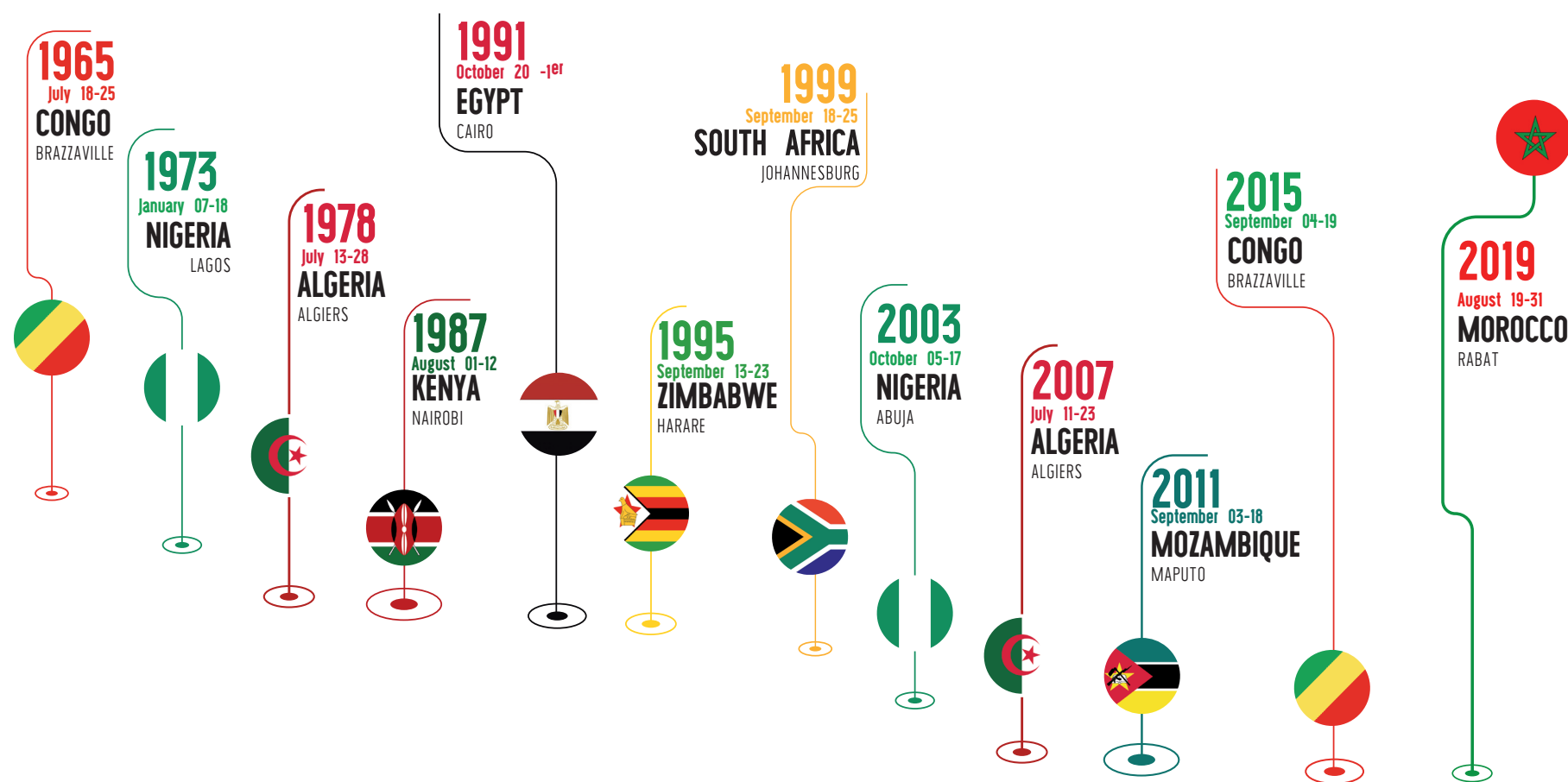


1.1 General Information

1.1.1 History of the African Games

Organized for the first time in 1965 in Brazzaville, the African Games celebrate from August 19th to August 31st, 2013 in Rabat, capital of the Kingdom of Morocco, its twelfth edition and the first after 50 years of existence. The opportunity for Africa to come back on the balance sheet and highlights of a multi-sport competition that the Kingdom of Morocco, in collaboration with African sports governing bodies, today wants to promote it to the rank of an event of notoriety international.

The African Games « All Games africa », Recognized from their launch by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), were celebrated eleven times in nine African cities.



1.1.2 Objectives of the Games

The objectives of the African Games are:

- Encourage young athletes to develop and reach the levels where they can represent their nations;
- Allow young people from different Member States to meet each other, get to know one another and get to know each other, in order to develop the necessary Community spirit and regional integration;
- Develop a spirit of fair play, mutual respect and Olympism among the continent's young athletes;
- To provide an opportunity for African countries to unite by working on a determined sports program of a common agreement ;
- The African Games are a multidisciplinary sports competition aimed at promoting high-level African sport and encouraging cultural exchanges between AU member states with NOCs.

1.1.3 12th African Games Rabat 2019

The African Games, also called Games from all over Africa are a multisport competition disputed every four years on the African continent.

Pierre of Coubertin, founder of the Olympic Games, had proposed the idea that will not be taken into account until the independence of the 1960s. Taking over the Friendship Games having involved the French-speaking countries, the first Games are organized in Brazzaville in 1965 and immediately recognized by the International Olympic Committee.

The 12th edition of the African Games, placed under the High Patronage of His Majesty King Mohammed VI, will be held in Rabat from 19 to 31 August 2019 at the conclusion of the Memorandum of Agreement signed in Rabat November 10, 2018 giving the UK the organization of these Games.

1.1.4 Rabat and the co-hosting cities

■ 1.1.4.1 Rabat



Rabat, capital of Morocco, is the 2nd largest city in Morocco. Founded in 1150 by the great Almohad sultan Abd al Moumen just north of the ancient Roman city of Sala Colonia (Chella). Rabat is the result of a fruitful dialogue between the Arab-Muslim past and Western modernism. In fact, in terms of culture and history, Rabat has a unique heritage, reflecting the diversity of legacies that have shaped both banks of Bouregreg during centuries. Since 2012, different historical sites of Rabat are on the list of World Heritage of Unesco.

Thanks to its pleasant climate, its privileged location on the edge of the Atlantic, its exceptional history, Rabat-Salé stands out as a leading tourist destination.

It is known for its monuments, its cultural spaces, its gates and speakers, as well as its parks and medina. Its coastline spreads about 60 km of coastline where rocky coves and sandy beaches follow each other. The hinterland offers an ecological diversity ideal for hiking.

■ 1.1.4.2 Casablanca



Casablanca, the most populous city in Morocco, is located 90 km south of the capital Rabat, stretched on the Atlantic coast. Casablanca went from a small port at the beginning of the 20th century to a large agglomeration. Indeed its population is estimated at 4.75 million inhabitants. She is ranked 3rd city in Africa after Lagos and Cairo in terms of population.*

The city is distinguished by its architecture joining the useful to the pleasant, by its old medina, its popular districts, its large buildings of the time of the protectorate, and those of the after independence with the construction of skyscrapers, administrative buildings, corporate headquarters, shopping centers, banks, hotels, social, cultural and sports facilities. Casablanca has become an international financial hub.

■ 1.1.4.3 Khémisset



Khemisset is the capital of the province which bears the same name. It is located in the area of Rabat-Salé-Kenitra . The province of Khemisset has the largest forest of Chenes-Lieges in the world.

the Maâmora forest, which covers an area of 133,000 ha. Khemisset is also known by its natural lake “Dayat Roumi” which is a protected nature reserve.

■ 1.1.4.4 El Jadida



El Jadida, provincial chief of the same name and also called Mazagan. Coastal city Morocco, located at 96 km of Casablanca.

The fortifications of the Portuguese city, with their bastions and ramparts, are an early example of Portuguese architecture. The Portuguese buildings still visible are the Portuguese cistern, the Portuguese fortress of Mazagan and the Church of the Assumption, built in the Manueline style. They offer an exceptional testimony to the cross-influences between European and Moroccan cultures.

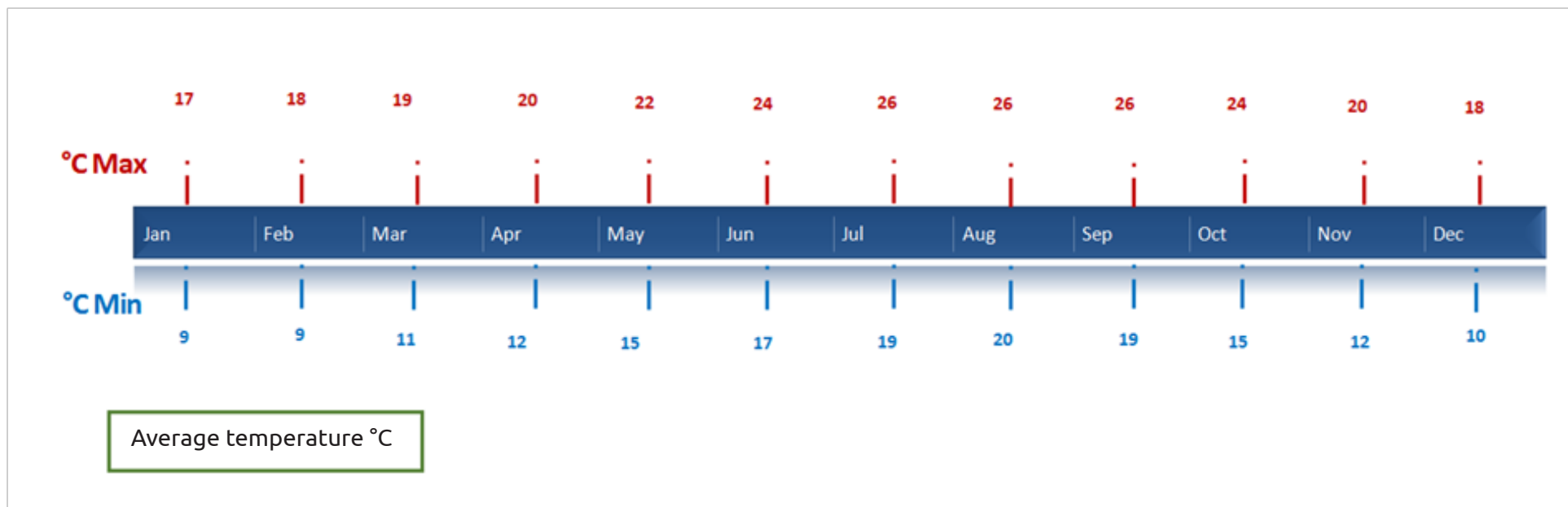
1.1.5 Climate

The Atlantic coast enjoys a favorable climate, similar to that of the Mediterranean, but even sweeter. Winters look like intermediate seasons, and have long sunny periods, and summers are pleasantly warm and sunny. The rains are not abundant, however, from November to March they can sometimes be intense and concentrated in time.

1.1.5.1 Weather in Rabat, Casablanca and El-Jadida

Located on the edge of the Atlantic Ocean, they have a temperate climate. The winter is mild and the rainfall is generally frequent. Summer is pleasantly warm.

Average temperatures range from 13 °C in January to 23 °C in July and August. Some coastal cities experience heat waves, which, however, are less intense and much rarer than in the interior of the country.

2.1 African Union «AU»

The African Union (UA) is an organization of African created in 2002, to Durban in South Africa, in application of the Sirte declaration of 9 September 1999. It replaced the Organization of African Unity (OAU). The establishment of these institutions took place in July 2003 at the top of Maputo the Mozambique.

Among its missions is the promotion of democracy, human rights and development across Africa, especially through increased foreign investment.





2.2 ANOCA: Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa

The Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa is an international organization based in Abuja, Nigeria, bringing together the fifty-four National Olympic Committees in Africa .

ANOCA was founded on 28 June 1981 in Lomé by Anani Matthia and Juan Antonio Samaranch with the help of Ydnekatchew Tessema. It was then called the Panafrican Olympic Institution at the service of sport, youth, human development and the promotion of Olympic values.

Missions:

- Promote conciliation between NOCs and governments ;
- Build the foundations of an ambitious sports policy ;
- Offer young athletes the conditions for success ;
- Promote sports initiatives ;
- Promote Olympic ideals and values in Africa;
- Participate in the fight against doping, corruption, violence and pandemics;
- Work to bring populations closer together through sport, to
- build an Africa in peace.



2.3 UCSAs: Union of African Sports Confederations

The Union of African Sports Confederations (UCSA) is a African sports organization. Its headquarters is currently Abuja, at Nigeria.

It carries out its activities through the General Assembly, which is the supreme body, and the Executive Board, which is the executive body.

It may also set up, as the case may be, specialized standing or ad hoc committees to assist it in performing its duties.

Missions:

- Promote understanding, cooperation and mutual aid among African sports confederations;
- Promote sports ethics, fair play and integrity in the management of sports activities in Africa;
- Promote and encourage the participation of women in the practice of sport and the administration of sports structures;
- Promote exchanges of experience in terms of administrative and technical organization;
- Promote the harmonization of calendars of courses, competitions and other events organized by African sports confederations;
- Contribute to the development of the programs of the African Games and ensure their organization and technical responsibility.



2.4 COJAR: Organizing Committee of the 12th African Games Rabat 2019

The Organizing Committee of the African Games of Rabat has for missions:



Organize the 2019 African Games;



Place the various sports on the program on an equal footing and ensure that the events are held in accordance with the rules;



Select and arrange the necessary facilities: competition venues, stadiums and training rooms ...;



Host the athletes, their escorts, the officials;



Set up medical services;



Provide the necessary logistics



Meet the needs of the media;



Organize cultural events. culturelles.



Write the final report on the celebration of the Games.

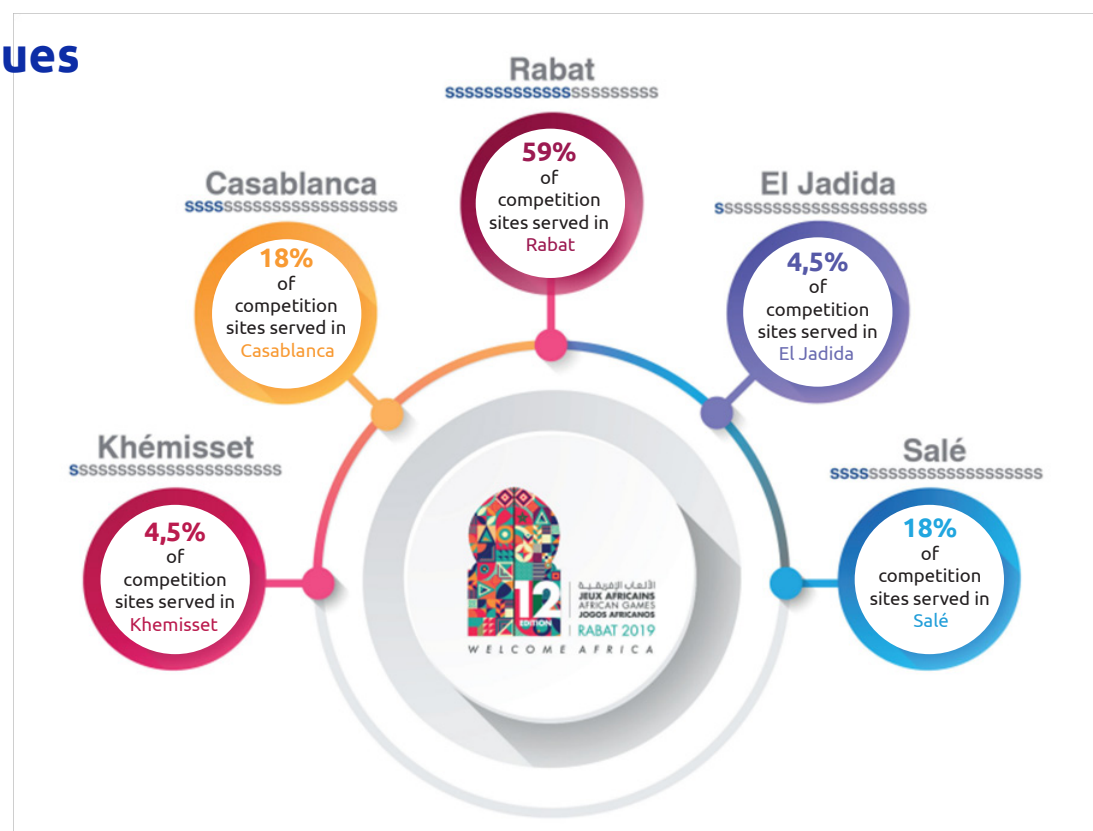
6 Competition and out-of-competition venues

The Bouregreg is a Moroccan river, 240 long kilometers, its average flow is 23 m³/s but, in times of flood, it can reach 1 500 m³/s.

It originates in the massif of Middle Atlas at the of 1 627 m at the level of Djebel Mtourzgane (Khemisset province) and Grou (Khenifra province) and flows into the Atlantic Ocean between the cities of Salé north and Rabat South.

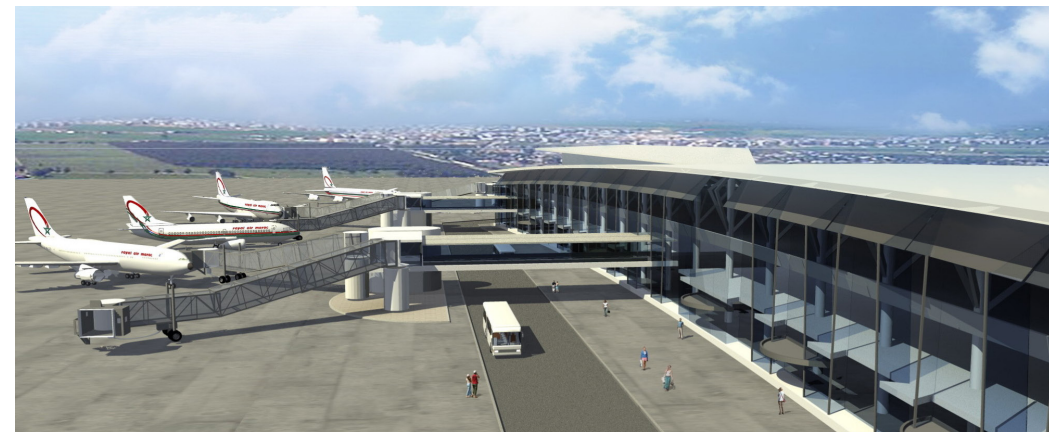

The security operation in the villages of the games, training sites and competitions will be provided by national security ... etc in close collaboration with the security team of the African Games Rabat 2019.

7.7 Operational areas for NOCs

The NOCs will have dedicated and equipped administrative and medical areas at their disposal.

These spaces will be located in the residential blocks and will be confirmed to the NOCs during their DRM.

7.8 Procedures for Arrivals/ Check-in and Departs/ Check-out

Athletes and officials will be able to register at the Villages as of August 13, 2019, the date of the opening of the Villages. The accommodation in the Village hotels will end on 3 September at 12.00 GMT, the closing date of the Villages. The members of the delegations will be accommodated (depending on the occupation).

The Organizing Committee Rabat 2019 will ensure the meals of participating athletes and standard officials (according to the rule of the calculator) 3 days before the start of the competition and up to 2 days after the end of the competition for a daily rate of US \$ 50 per day per person.

Additional nights and additional officials will be charged at a daily rate of US \$ 150 per day. (See point 3 Article 12 of the General Regulations of the Games: Each participant must pay a participation fee)

7.9 Entry to the African Village Check-in procedures

9.9.1 Confirmation of check-in during DRM.

Each Chef de Mission will receive a form of accommodation for members of his delegation residing at the Games Villages and who has been duly confirmed at the DRM. This form must be completed with the complete list of people who will be accommodated in each room, as well as the changes in occupancy. The Chef de Mission must present the list to the Accommodation Office of the African Village Resident Services Center. This list will contain the check-in and check-out dates of each person as well as any changes due to the departures and arrivals of other members of the delegation (new check-in and check-out dates). Room keys will be available to delegations at hotel receptions, once the Department of accommodation has given its approval.

The Heads of Mission or their representatives will be responsible for the correct use of rooms and facilities in hotels by the members of their delegations.

The rooms will be checked every day and the

management of the hotels to register any possible damage on a «Form of damage» which will be immediately transmitted to the Chef de Mission or his representative.

Before the departure of each resident delegation to the hotels, before the departure of the Chef de Mission, a check-out meeting will be organized at the Accommodation Office of the African Village Resident Services Center. The Chef de Mission or his representative must sign the form with or without consent. Keys will be returned at this time.

Once this process has been finalized, the Chef de Mission or his representative will visit the Village Resident Services Center Finance Office for payment.

The amounts for damages and loss of keys will be calculated by the staff of the Bureau of Finance and included on the account of each delegation with the rest of the services (extra nights, extra official stays, etc.).

7.9.2 Key replacement

If a resident asks for help to return to his room due to a lost or damaged key, the hotel staff will fix it. The list of residents will be checked and a replacement key will be provided after authorization by the Chef de Mission or his representative. Replacement of a lost or damaged key will be done.

7.9.3 Police for the damage

COJAR will charge for damaged or missing items in the Residential Zone, extra cleaning (for example, deep cleaning due to smoking in the rooms), or removal of abandoned items. The NOC will have to pay all damage to COJAR before departure.

7.9.4 Deployment of flags, banners or other elements of NOCs

The deployment of any flag, banner or other element must first be approved by COJAR. These elements must remain on the space allocated to the NOC and will not encroach on or block the eyes of another NOC.

7.9.5 Linguistic Services

During the Games, assistants will be available to assist the NOCs and also for language issues.

7.9.6 Lost and found objects

All lost property or lost property returns must be forwarded to the Resident Center. COJAR will activate a register of lost and found objects which will be accessible to this Center. The accreditation card and an identification copy will be required to claim these items; Residents will be directed to the specific center where the items will be stored for retrieval.

7.9.7 Rules on tobacco, alcohol and the ban on cooking

In Morocco, it is forbidden to smoke in enclosed spaces and buildings open to the public or used as a workplace. All areas of the African Village, as well as residences, are non-smoking.

A limited number of outdoor areas reserved for smokers, and clearly indicated, will be available within the Village.

The alcohol will not be on Salé in the African Village and its consumption is prohibited.

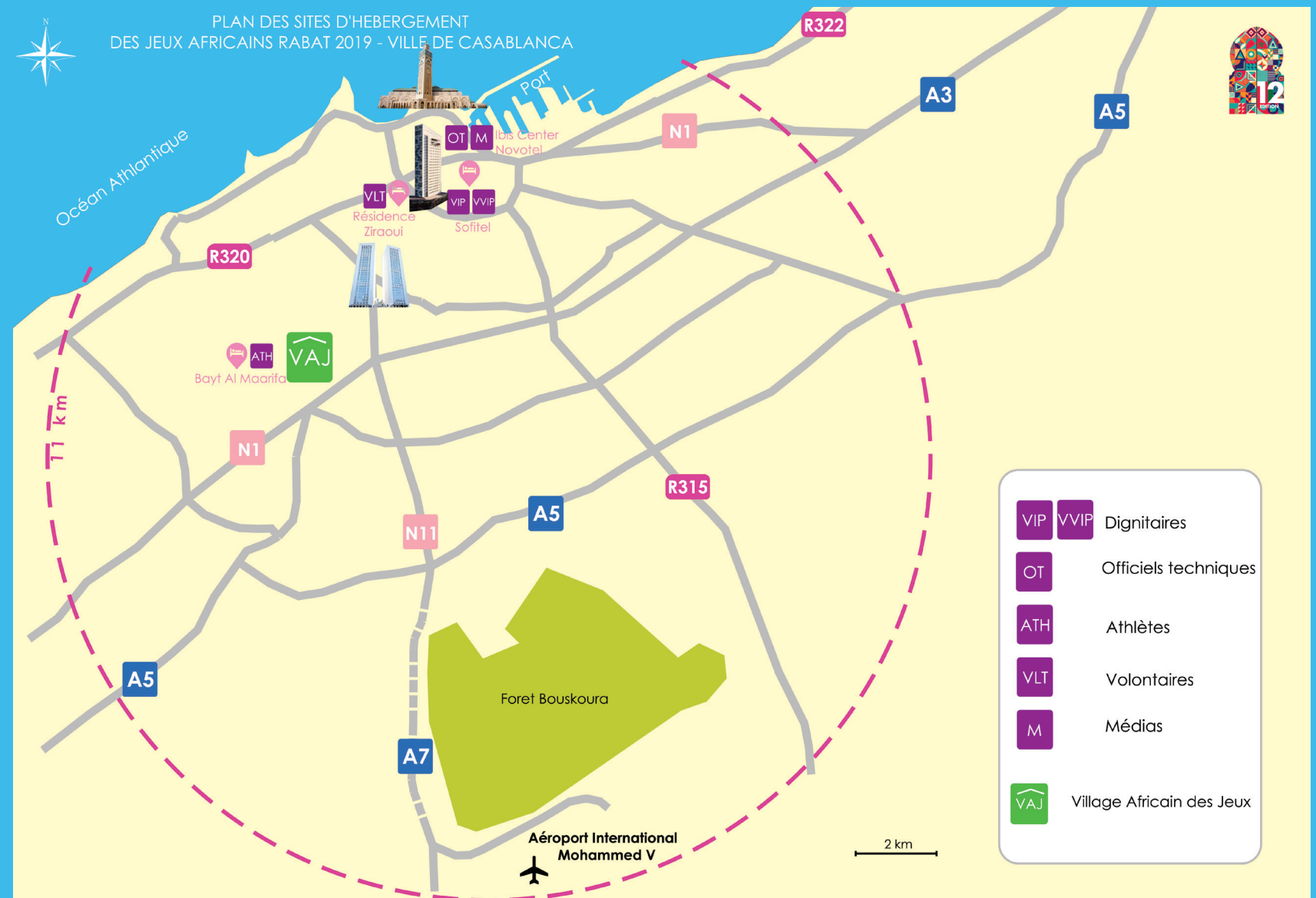

8.3 Additional vehicles and rental service

Logistics and Freight

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COJAR will set up a forwarder to facilitate the transit and acquisition of equipment and materials from participating delegations and other accredited entities in the framework of the organization of the African Games.

Useful information regarding the dates and arrival points of this material must be communicated to COJAR in a timely manner.

9.1 Freight Shipping Procedure and Shipping Policy

9.1.1 Tax exemption on cargo imports (Cargo)

The table below summarizes the different tax exemption scenarios applicable to each type of goods:

⁽²⁾ At the procedural level, this tax benefit is granted under the following conditions:

- For recognized associations of public utility:

The benefit of this tax benefit is granted directly by the head of the customs import office on presentation, by the beneficiaries of the donation, the form called «Request for exemption from customs duty for goods received as a gift», available on the website of this Administration at www.douane.gov.ma and whose model is attached.

- charities:

The tax exemption is granted by the head of the customs import office to the goods and merchandise intended to be distributed free of charge to the needy, the victims of disaster or to render free humanitarian services, on production of the favorable opinions of the National Mutual Aid and the department (s) responsible for the resource (Ministry in Charge of Foreign Trade).

Customs formalities must be performed by the beneficiary and not the donor.

Finally, it should be noted that in both cases the customs exemption does not exempt the recipient of the grant from the completion of the formalities required by special regulations.

9.1.2 Suspension of duties and taxes under the customs procedure of temporary admission

The importation under the temporary admission of the materials is authorized directly by the customs services of the office of entry under the following conditions:

- presentation of ATA notebooks issued by the chambers of commerce of the country of dispatch; or
- subscription of temporary admission declarations covered by bank guarantee or deposit of the amount of duties and taxes payable.

It should be noted, moreover, that the temporary admission of telecommunication and filming equipment is subject to the production respectively of the prior agreement of the ANRT and the Ministry in charge of communication.

In addition, the importation of drones under the temporary admission regime is subject to special authorization issued by the ministerial department concerned. As such, it is appropriate to address a request for temporary admission of UAVs at least seven (07) days before the date of importation of the drone to the Service of Customs Economic Regimes (Central Administration of Customs).

Material which has not been re-exported partially or totally at the end of this event will be subject to the payment of the duties and taxes payable under the prevailing regulatory conditions and the fulfillment, if necessary, of the formalities required under the special regulations.

Consumable products definitively imported into Morocco cannot benefit from the temporary admission procedure and they must, therefore, pay the duties and taxes payable at the time of their importation under the conditions in force.

9.1.2.1 Commercial imports

For items imported beyond the authorized quantities, they must be the subject of a customs declaration with payment of the corresponding duties and taxes and completion of special regulations and foreign exchange where applicable.

9.1.2.2 Prohibited goods

Certain goods may be imported into Morocco, in particular:

- weapons, weapons and war ammunition;
- recorded writings, printed matter, cassettes and videocassettes and any object contrary to morality and public order;
- certain plants and plant products likely to be carriers of harmful organisms or dangerous for the national flora;

9.1.2.3 Medicines and Medical Supplies

As part of a stay in Morocco, medicines that are reamed with the persons concerned for their personal use are admitted free (exemption) of import duties and taxes provided that:

- Produce related medical documents (medical certificate, prescription, etc.)
- Subscribe a commitment to use these drugs only for personal needs and to re-export the unused amount at the end of your stay in the Kingdom.

9.1.2.4 Food Products and Beverages

Beyond the quantities recognized for personal consumption, all quantities that exceed, will be subject to taxation and clearance formalities in force.

9.1.2.5 Fodder, Feed, Supplements And Litter For Horses

9.1.2.5.1 Horse feed and haylage:

The admission for free circulation of the products concerned is subject to the control carried out by the competent services of the National Office for Sanitary Safety of Food Products, present at the border posts.

9.1.2.5.2 Drugs and supplements:

The admission for free circulation of the products concerned is subject to the control carried out by the competent services of the National Office for Sanitary Safety of Food Products, present at the border posts.

9.1.2.6 Freight Support Plan of the African Games Rabat 2019

9.1.2.6.1 Firearms

- Carrying of arms
- Competition rifles

The import of other weapons of war is subject to the presentation of an authorization issued by the General Directorate of National Security.

9.1.2.6.2 Arcs

The importation of these articles is subject to the presentation of a license issued by the Department of Foreign Trade.

9.1.2.6.3 Swords

The importation of these articles is subject to the presentation of a license issued by the Department of Foreign Trade.

9.1.2.6.4 Drones

The final importation of UAVs is subject to the presentation of a license issued by the Department of Foreign Trade.

9.1.2.6.5 Horses

Temporary admission of horses is granted under the same conditions mentioned above (submission of ATA carnets or subscription of a customs declaration, see section 1.2 suspension of duties and taxes under the customs procedure of temporary admission).

The importation of horses under all customs procedures is subject to the veterinary health control carried out by the competent services under the National Office of Sanitary Safety of Food Products, present at border posts

9.1.2.6.6 Boats

The vessels imported on the occasion of this event will be placed under the temporary admission procedure, the formalities of which will be carried out by the importer directly at the first customs office of entry.

- The COJAR according to the accreditation chart approved by the CCJA, will send the NOC an accreditation guide to help participating NOCs and all other rights groups to prepare for the accreditation process and sports entries for the 12th African Games Rabat 2019.
 - The CCJA determines the categories that can obtain an accreditation card and the conditions, access rights, privileges and quotas for issuing cards to participants according to their roles. COJAR reserves the right to issue or refuse accreditation to access Games venues.
 - All the privileges that ANOCA, CCJA and COJAR have granted for the accreditations of the 12th African Games-Rabat 2019 are found in the Accreditation Charter attached to this handbook.
- Each category will receive a copy of this charter, which contains all the privileges that correspond to it.
- Accreditation is used to identify and register all participants with a role in the Games and to grant them the necessary privileges to fulfill their function (s).
 - The accreditations do not replace visas which would be required for entry into the national territory.
 - COJAR, in collaboration with ANOCA and CCJA, has set deadlines for accreditation for each of the recognized Responsible Organizations (ROs). Each OR must designate a person responsible for accreditation (PRA) will be the primary contact for COJAR everything will deal with accreditation. For the NOCs, the PRA is the chef de mission officially designated by its NOC. The latter may delegate this task to another person provided that COJAR is informed by official mail.
 - The COJAR will issue the accreditation card, upon presentation of a valid identity card or passport, to each participant who has correctly provided their data within the fixed deadlines, past any security checks and met the criteria set by ANOCA and COJAR.
 - The identity card or passport must be valid for at least six months after the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.
 - The accreditation card will be the only valid ID during the Games, which will serve as a pass and access to the various Games venues and identify the privileges assigned to the accredited person.
 - Applications for the accreditation card will only be admissible from a RO through its PRA. No application for individual accreditation will be accepted. ROs are those recognized by ANOCA.
 - The accreditation categories recognized by ANOCA and CCJA, according to the official charter of accreditations, are as follows:
 - ANOCA
 - The IOC
 - The NOCs
 - FIs
 - The COJAR
 - The media covering the Games (broadcasters/ radio (ERT))

Each category must be accredited by its RO, as follows:

- All data provided during the accreditation process must be accurate.
- ROs must pay particular attention to ensuring that all data is correct: spelling of names, numbers of identity documents, dates of birth, etc.
- ROs are officially recognized by COJAR as participating organizations, responsible for the various tasks related to the deployment of their delegation.
- Only these ROs are authorized by COJAR to request accreditation for their delegation. ROs are responsible for managing the accreditation process for all third parties or subcontractors they would require to take part in the Games.
- ROs must designate an ARO who will be responsible for administering the management of accreditations. ROs must comply with all existing legislation concerning the collection of personal data of the members of their delegation and, if necessary, obtain their authorization to share this data with ANOCA and COJAR.

10.4 Accreditation card

The accreditation card must be worn by all participants to gain access to the sites during the Games. The elements printed on the map will be large enough to allow staff access control and the security to quickly check whether a participant is authorized to access a site or certain areas of this site. The card contains certain security features that prevent any counterfeiting or fraudulent use. Details on the map will be printed in both French and English.

Using the CIAA, the wearer agrees to:

- Be filmed, televised, photographed, identified or recorded during the African Games of Rabat 2019, under the conditions and for the purposes that are or will be authorized by COJAR, in relation with ANOCA.
- That all moving photographs and images taken by him at the African Games, including those of the athletes in the Games' sports facilities, will only be used for individual, non-commercial purposes, unless the prior written consent has been given obtained from ANOCA and/or COJAR.
- Confirm also that he/she meets the qualifications and conditions required by ANOCA and/or COJAR to receive this accreditation card.
- Authorize the use of the information collected about it by ANOCA and COJAR, and to enable this data to be used by them and, if necessary, by third parties, in order to facilitate its participation and/or organization of the African Games.

Further details on the accreditation process, and more specifically on the collection of data through the online system, will be provided to the various categories through the Online Accreditation System User Guide. once it is ready for use.

10.5 Categories, functions and quotas

The categories and quotas of accreditation cards by function are determined by ANOCA in collaboration with COJAR.

A person with multiple duties will only have one accreditation card for the Games period. ANOCA, through COJAR, may authorize a merger of accreditation privileges for exceptional reasons, if a person had to perform several functions.

Replacements are NOT allowed during the 12th African Games Rabat 2019.

Rotations and transfer of CIAA from one person to another or from one category to another are not permitted.

10.8 Accreditation process

The online accreditation system will be accessible, in French and in English, for each OR, with a username and a password that will be unique to it. More details will be available in due course.

10.8.1 Accreditation and Registration Process for NOC Delegations

The NOCs are one of the largest categories of the 12th African Games Rabat 2019 since this category includes a large number of people, basically athletes and officials.

Even though the online accreditation system will be used by all participating categories to enter their data, the NOCs will merge their athlete accreditation process with the registration process through the online accreditation system.

This is why it is absolutely necessary to mention the process of accreditation and registration of delegations in this document.

The NOCs will receive, before the opening of the online accreditation

system, the calculator (calculation rule for the Games) in order to obtain the total number of their officials, depending on the number of participating athletes.

The calculator will be provided to the NOCs to allow them a complete understanding of the process.

10.8.1.1 Before opening the online accreditation system

COJAR will provide the following documentation to the NOCs:

- Online Accreditation System User Guide ;
- Account user form, for individual access to the system ;
- Accreditation manual updated, in case of any changes ;
- The calculation of the size of the CNO delegation for the Games
- Any other information necessary regarding access to the system.

10.8.1.2 Opening the online accreditation system

The NOCs will be able to begin to introduce all the data on their athletes and potential officials into the CNO category, without limits of people.

All participating athletes must be citizens of the country they represent, according to IOC rules. Athletes must be registered in each event in which they may participate.

10.8.1.3 Nominative registrations (long list)

Preliminary entries with information from all athletes possibly participating in the Games must be sent to COJAR through the online accreditation system, **June 30, 2019**.

Any athlete who may participate in the Games must be registered for each event (minimum one) in which he/she may ultimately be engaged.

Officials participating in the Games must be registered within the same time frame.

NOCs are requested to include on the long list any members who may be part of the official delegation (athletes and officials), without any limit to preliminary entries, because no athlete or official can be added after this date.

10.8.1.4 Definitive registration (short list)

No later than 18 days before the start of the Games, ie the **July 31st, 2019**, the NOCs will have to send the final list of their nominative entries by event, according to their initial long list, by the system in question. Accreditation line, confirming the names of participating athletes from those included in the long list and already registered.

10.8.1.5 DRM

Delegation Confirmation Meetings (DRM) are individual meetings between each NOC Chef de Mission and COJAR to confirm any official changes to the short list. With the collaboration of ANOCA Pre-DRM can be organized in **June 2019**. Further information on Pre-DRM and DRM will be provided in due course.

The final list of accreditation and registration of each NOC must be included in the minutes of the DRM, which must be signed by the Chef de Mission at the end of the DRM.

10.8.2 «Special Passes»,»Guests Passes» and «Daily Passes»

10.8.2.1 Pass for the guests

These documents are issued for specific Games venues for non-accredited persons, such as African Villages or other Games venues.

10.8.2.2 Pass for the African Village

Athletes are at the heart of the Games and to ensure that they live in a safe and secure environment to prepare for their competitions, access to the Village is strictly controlled.

African Villages are mainly residential areas that can only be accessed by people who have the privilege of accessing them. Accredited persons may have access to the Village Operational Zone and/or Residential Zone with a pass that may vary as indicated below.

There are three types of passes for African Villages:

10.8.2.2.1 The NOC guests' pass

That gives access to the operational areas of the Village and accompanied access to the residential area.

Quotas for this category are determined by the size of the delegation.

10.8.2.2.2 The media pass

That gives access to limited, restricted and very specific areas of the Village. Quotas for this category are dictated by ANOCA and CCJA.

10.8.2.2.3 The protocol pass for guests

That gives access to the operational zones of the Village and an accompanied access to the residential area. It is the Protocol Center that deals with this group.

These passes were created strictly for the purpose of preserving the privacy of the athletes. They are distributed on presentation of the accreditation card or the identity card or passport which will be deposited at the entrance in exchange for the daily pass for the African Village.

Daily quotas are set by COJAR. The ROs are responsible for the registration of their guests in advance and are also responsible for informing them of all arrangements made by COJAR, such as presenting original identity documents, for example.

Pass requests must be submitted at least 48 hours before the date of the visit, to have access from 3:00 pm at the Village Africans' pass center. All guests must respect the security guidelines established by the host country. ROs cannot exceed their quota for the guests. No guest will have access to the African Village if a request has not been made in advance.

In order to collect their pass, guests must go to the Pass Center, which is at

the entrance to the African Village, under the control of COJAR. They will have to leave their accreditation card or another official identity document, such as passport or identity card.

Pass holders for guests must leave the Village no later than 8 pm and return their passes daily. That's when they will retrieve their accreditation card or other identity document.

10.8.2.3 Guest passes for other sites

COJAR may establish laissez- passer for guests to provide access to other competition venues or not, if requested by the ROs. Any procedures will be determined and communicated in due course.

10.8.2.4 Access to restricted areas

Certain zones, sessions, areas and ceremonies may require, in addition to the accreditation card, other devices such as a banner on the arm, a bib or an entrance ticket. These devices are called Additional Access Devices (AEDs). All DSAs must be approved by COJAR and registered with the relevant accreditation function.

All DSAs must be used with the accreditation card since they do not give access to any site or area in themselves.

10.9 Accreditation Installations and Accreditation Team

Accreditation centers of the 12th African Games Rabat 2019 will be:

- Main Accreditation Center (CPA) at the African Village: for athletes, team officials, COJAR and functional staff; technical officials ;
- African Family Accreditation Center, at the main hotel of the African Family: for AU, ANOCA, CIO, FI, NOC, UCSA dignitaries and other guests;
- Accrediting Center for Media This center will be located at the Main Press Center.

The operating hours of the three accreditation centers will be as follows :

- CPA at the African Village: 24 hours a day ;
- Accreditation Center for the African Family, at the main hotel of the African Family: 09:00 to 19:00 (except arrivals earlier or later, communicated in advance) ;
- Accreditation Center for the Media: 09:00 to 19:00 (except arrivals earlier or later, communicated in advance).

In the event that an accredited person loses his accreditation card, he will have to go to one of the three centers that concerns him, with his identity card or passport, in order to obtain a duplicate of his accreditation card.. She will have to complete a declaration of loss of card before obtaining a new one.

visa requirements

Each member of the delegation taking part in the games must hold a valid passport at least six months after the planned date of departure from the territory of the Kingdom of Morocco, accompanied by the necessary visa, or temporary access authorization..

The members of the delegations not benefiting from exemption of visa, are invited to carry out the steps with a view to obtaining a visa of entry in Morocco with the diplomatic or consular mission of Morocco covering their country of residence.

Failing this, arrangements are made to grant entry visas on arrival at the airport.

No visa application will be processed if it is not submitted by the concerned NOC and for non-registered persons on the online African Games accreditation system.

Minors must also have parental authorization. Be in possession of a valid visa. This requirement is required for third-country nationals on the list of countries subject to the visa requirement for border crossing.

Further information will be communicated to the NOCs on the visa application procedure and the information required.

Correspondence will be sent to the various Embassies of the Kingdom of Morocco, with a view to facilitating the procedures for granting visas to participants duly registered by their NOCs.

11.1 Nationalities exempted from visa :

3. Congo-Brazzaville, Mali, Guinea Conakry, are invited to request an electronic travel authorization to Morocco AEVM at least 96 hours before their date of departure to Morocco via the portal:

11.2 Obtaining a visa for nationals of countries without Moroccan representation

Countries whose participants can benefit from LC (Visa Confirmation Letters) to obtain visas at the airport are:

Eritrea, Djibouti, Somalia, Uganda, Burundi, Seychelles, Comoros, Sao Tome and Principe, Guinea Bissau, Liberia, Botswana, Lesotho, Mauritius, Namibia, Swaziland, Zambia, Malawi and Zimbabwe).

In this case, COJAR will appoint a representative to contact the services of the Department of Consular and Social Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation to introduce requests to recover the LCs of the concerned participants once ready, and pass them ; these documents must be presented to the competent Moroccan authorities upon their arrival at the airport.

The basic file must consist of a copy of the valid passport and the following table duly completed.

11.3 Nationalities subject to visa

Nationals of all other countries must obtain a visa at embassies and consulates of the Kingdom of Morocco.

Applicants must submit their application for a visa to the Diplomatic Missions and Consular Posts of Morocco in their country of residence as soon as possible

The basic file must consist of a copy of the valid passport, the residence permit and the invitation to the event and any proof requested by the Mission or the Post Office.

11.4 People holding a residence card

Persons not residing in their country of origin must hold a residence permit valid for six months after the event has taken place

People holding a Moroccan residence permit must not exceed six months outside the national territory.

Protocol and Ceremonies



12.1 Opening ceremony

- A protocol must be observed at the opening and closing ceremony of the African Games.
- The opening ceremony of the All Africa Games Rabat 2019 will take place at the Moulay Abdallah Sports Complex from 19h.
- Access to the tribune of honor and the VIP and VIP stands will be reserved for the holders of a particular invitation.
- Invited guests will be taken to the VVIP and VIP lounges where they will join the tribune of honor.
- A welcome cocktail will be provided to welcome them

Opening ceremony, will include:

- An artistic and choreographic show promoting the image of the Kingdom of Morocco in Africa and in the world ;
- A show of sound and light;
- Musical performances;
- Accompanied by the parade of countries articipan t ;

12.2 Closing ceremony

- The closing ceremony of the African Games Rabat 2019 will take place at the Sports Complex Moulay Abdallah from 19h ;
- Access to the tribune of honor and VVIP and VIP grandstands will be reserved for the holders of a special invitation ;
- Invitations will be distributed the day before the ceremony ;
- Invited guests will be taken to the VIP and VVIP lounges where they will join the tribune of honor ;
- A Welcome Cocktail will be hosted.

The closing ceremony will include:

- Une A video retracing the highlights of the Games ;
- A choreographic show ;
- A parade of the participating countries ;
- A fire show x artifice;
- Presentation and announcement of the African Games 2023 ;

12.3 Transportation service for ceremonies

Special arrangements are made to transport VIPs and VVIPs to the venue.

12.4 Medals Ceremonies

12.4.1 Presentation of the ceremony

After each event, a medal ceremony not exceeding 10 minutes will be held, a protocol must be respected during the medal ceremonies. A protocol officer must ensure the establishment of flags and national anthem welcomes personalities, winners and leads to a lounge or private place.

The protocol officer reminds all participants of the ceremony and forms the procession:

- Protocol Agent ;
- Bronze medalist ;
- Silver medalist ;
- The gold medalist ;
- Hostesses carrying medals and bouquets of flowers ;
- The personalities to give the medals ;
- A protocol officer closes the march.

The protocol officer informs the presenter of the establishment of the procession, a note of music announces to the public a ceremony of awarding the medals.

The presenter announces the presentation of the medals according to the agreed text, and announces the raising of the colors and the national anthem of the country of the laureate who won the event.

At the end of the hymn, a photo is made with the medalists and personalities.

The protocol officer signifies the end of the ceremony and leaves the scene after reforming the procession identical to that of the arrival.

Medias



13.1 Main Press Center (MPC) and International Broadcast Center (IBC)

Conscious of the importance of the media coverage of this continental sports event, a main press center will be made available to accredited national and international media.

This media infrastructure, installed at the Prince Moulay Abdellah Sports Complex in Rabat, will be equipped with a space guaranteeing excellent working conditions, including a reliable telecommunications service (permanent and secure power supply) and Internet access at Broadband.

The CPPs of Rabat and Casablanca will have several workspaces equipped with Internet workstations for the media with a maximum capacity of 60 journalists (CPP Casablanca) and 250 journalists (CPP Rabat).

In addition, accredited broadcasters will have a Radio and Broadcast Center at the venues of the sports competitions to enable them to broadcast competitions live.

Other practical information relating to these centers will be available in due course.

13.2 Facilities and services for the media

Several services are available to journalists at the CPP and the IBC, who can permanently benefit from internet access, press conference rooms with a capacity of 200 people and fixed telephony.

13.3 Hosting for the media

Practical information on hotels offered by COJAR for national and international media will be communicated at the appropriate time specifying prices, terms of payment and reservation system.

13.4 Accreditation for media and dates

Accreditation is granted to national and international media representatives in good standing to submit evidence of their profession (AIPS card, press card, or national professional certificate, or other document.....).

Like all applications for accreditation, print and audio visual media must go through the responsible OR, such as the NOC of the country where the press organization is domiciled.

No application for accreditation will be processed by COJAR if it does not emanate from the responsible OR.

13.5 Transportation Services

The media will benefit from a permanent transport service made available to them by COJAR, so shuttles connecting the hotels where the media are hosted to the competition sites and press centers of Casablanca and Rabat will circulate every two hours between 08:00 and 22:00.

14.1 Institutional and commercial information

14.1.1 Corporate identity and use of logos

14.1.1.1 Introduction

In accordance with the conditions provided for in the Memorandum of Understanding between the AU, ANOCA and UCSA concerning the organization and management of the Games

Africans and related programs, COJAR and ANOCA are in charge of promoting this 12th edition of the African Games on their territory.

COJAR and ANOCA with the NOCs are a partnership to broaden the broadcast of the Games and to engage various audiences with the events. To this end, the non-commercial use of the brands of the 12th edition of the African Games Rabat 2019, will be offered for said partners.

14.1.1.2 Pre-approved use of Rabat 2019 brands for NOCs

The marks of the 12th edition of the African Games Rabat in 2019 that can be used for non-commercial purposes and that are currently available are:

14.1.1.2.1 The logo of the African Games Rabat 2019

The logo has been chosen and approved jointly by all concerned bodies. The conditions and instructions specific to its use, in any medium, are specified in the graphic charter (the corresponding file will be accessible on the JAR2019 website).

14.1.1.2.2 Nominative marks (symbolic words)

14.1.1.2.3 The mascot :

14.1.1.2.4 The pictograms:

The pictograms of the 12th edition of the 2019 Rabat African Games for 29 sports disciplines are as follows:



14.1.1.3 Pre-Approved Marks and Permitted Uses for NOCs

The aforementioned marks are authorized to be used by the NOCs, under the following conditions:

- The NOCs have the right to use the trademark «Africa Games Rabat2019» for editorial purposes such as publications and materials below: Monthly newsletters ; brochures annual reports ;other non-commercial documents in which it is appropriate to refer to the African Games Rabat 2019 ;
- The NOCs are authorized to use the brand «African Games Rabat2019» to illustrate by way of example an article about the event or to make publications related to the event on their website and social networks ;
- NOCs can put information, articles and images related to the 2019 African Games Rabat on their website ;
- The NOCs may include on their website, the links of the official website of the 2019 African Games Rabat ;
- Any intellectual property: sub-brands, image of the Games, videos, images, publications or other graphic elements created since the declination of the JAR2019's own graphic charter ; during the period before the African Olympics Rabat 2019 will be integrated in the list of intellectual properties of ANOCA.
- If the NOCs wish to use the aforementioned elements for non-commercial purposes, they may make a request to ANOCA.
- NOCs can use the joint signature with Rabat Africa Games in 2019 on their letterhead and business cards, depending on the conditions of use in the graphic.
- For uniforms, the identity of the African Games Rabat 2019 may be displayed on the uniforms using the logo or the brand's symbol words in accordance with the rules of use provided for in the graphic charter.

14.1.1.4 Unauthorized uses that should be avoided

14.1.1.4.1 Unauthorized associations with the African Games Rabat 2019 :

The use of trademarks is absolutely unauthorized in the context of an association between the 2019 African Games and third parties, especially commercial organizations.

It is strictly forbidden to place these marks alongside other brands in documents, publications or websites, or in any other medium.

The NOCs are not allowed to use the brand African Games RABAT 2019 in publications or materials for commercial or promotional reasons (magazines, books...).

14.1.1.4.2 Suspension of pre-approved and authorized uses

COJAR and ANOCA reserve the right to suspend the use of JAR 2019 marks by NOCs in case of non-compliance with the rules in this section.

14.1.1.5 Other brands of the African Games Rabat 2019

During the period before the Rabat 2019 African Games, a series of other intellectual properties could be created: sub-brands, image of the Games, videos, images, publications or other graphic elements. All these elements will be included in the intellectual property list of Games Africains Rabat 2019.

However, if the NOCs wish to use these elements for non-commercial purposes, they may apply to ANOCA.

14.1.2 Ticketing

For the Rabat2019 African Games, according to the general regulations for the organization of sports events, access to the competition venues will be free.

COJAR is responsible in this part of

- Produce entrance tickets ;
- Divide the seats on the competition sites ;

Issuing tickets required by the CTCJA, the CSUA Secretariat, brand hosts, guests, official sponsors and suppliers, media personnel and volunteers.

- Zones reserved for athletes and officials will be designated on the competition sites.
- The capacity of these areas, which will be accessible with an accreditation card, will vary according to the capacity of each facility.

15.1 Introduction

16.1 Medical Services

Medical services for the 2019 All Africa Games will be available at the competition and training venues, as well as at the athlete accommodation sites. The vast majority of medical services will be offered during site opening hours, with a 24-hour emergency service.

16.3 Medical Transportation

18.3.1 Ambulances

Ambulances will be on-site, during operating hours, at all 2019 All-Africa Games training and competition venues and on 24-hour Athlete Accommodation and Call for Hotels locations.

18.3.2 Non-urgent medical transportation

In some cases, ambulance transportation may not be necessary to transport a patient to or from the referral hospital. In these cases, COJAR will provide cars for this type of transport.

16.4 Medical services of accommodation sites

A medical center will be located in each accommodation site and will be the main treatment provider for the urgent services needed by NOC athletes and team officials during the Games. The medical center will be open from August 13 to September 1, 2019.

Services will be available between 07:00 and 23:00, seven days a week, with a 24-hour emergency service.

The services of the medical center will include :

- First Aid and Emergency Services
- Sports Medicine Consultation
- Dental consultation
- Pharmacy
- Therapeutic massage and physiotherapy

The medical center will not have rooms for the night, if the patient needs additional treatments, he will be transferred to the referral hospital. Refer to the list of hospitals designated by COJAR 2019.

NOC registered physicians will be able to apply for medical imaging and laboratory services and discuss the results with their counterparts at COJAR 2019 Medical Services.

Only the medical staff of COJAR 2019 will be able to decide on a transfer to the hospital. NOC doctors will be able to accompany the team members to the hospital and discuss therapeutic issues with the doctor responsible for care at the hospital.

Hotels selected for VIP accommodation will have a 24/7 emergency medical service on request.

The medical service will have a 24-hour emergency telephone number if emergency medical assistance is requested outside of the hours of operation indicated above. The number will be given to the doctors of the NOC teams upon their arrival.

A pharmacy will be installed at the Village des Games ; only available drugs can be dispensed by the person in charge of the program.

The list of medicines made available will be published on the medical guide of the 2019 All Africa Games. Available on the Games website.

16.5 Medical Services Training Sites

Each training site will have medical assistance for athletes, team officials and any other person who may be present at the training site, including pass holders for the training venue. First aid and emergency care services will be available.

Athletes' medical services will be available one hour before the start of training and will close one hour after their completion.

At all training sites ice will be provided and will be located in the sports equipment warehouse area. The NOCs will have free access to the ice cubes, but they will have to take care of the packaging themselves and the transport themselves.

16.6 Medical services of the competition sites

A medical post for the athletes will be located in each competition site of the games. The medical station will take care of athletes, team officials and technical officials and will be located in the athletes area of the competition venue.

Each medical station for athletes will have a staff of doctors, nurses and physiotherapists. Each of them will be equipped with essential first aid and emergency equipment.

Available services will include first aid, emergency care, sports medicine and physiotherapy.

Athletes' medical positions will be open one hour and a half before the start of the competition and will close one hour after the end.

In all competition venues, the ice cubes provided will be located in the warehouse area of the equipment. The NOCs will have free access to the ice cubes, but they will have to take care of the packaging themselves and the transport themselves.

16.7 Medical teams of intervention on the zone of competition

Local Response Teams will provide first aid and emergency services to athletes and officials, as needed. Each local intervention team will be led by a doctor.

Local Response Teams will be equipped with essential emergency and emergency equipment and will be located near the Athletes' Medical Station. If necessary, the athlete will be evacuated from the competition area and transported to the Athletes' Medical Center, or referral hospital. The order of intervention on the competition area and any decision making will differ on each site, in accordance with the rules of the respective African confederations.

Any emergency treatment taking place in the competition area will be the responsibility of the Games Medical Team in consultation with the CN O medical teams who will be able to treat any minor injuries of the athletes of their delegation on the spot. COJAR may assist any team that does not have medical staff in the competition area.

16.8 Spectator Medical Services

All official 2019 African Games competition venues will have one or more medical stations for spectators who will provide emergency and first aid services to any other person (spectators, staff, media, sponsors).

Other members of the NOC medical staff (including physiotherapists and nurses) will not need to register with the Moroccan authorities to treat the members of their delegation.

16.9 Medical Services at the airport level

Knowing that all airports in Morocco are equipped with a medical duty station, COJAR will contact the National Office of Airports to involve it in the medical coverage of game x Africans 2019.

In cases where it is necessary for members of the NOC delegation to be transferred to a hospital, the NOC doctor may accompany the patient and discuss the treatment with the hospital medical team. Medical responsibility, however, rests with the doctor in charge of admission and only returns to the NOC doctor after leaving the hospital.

The medical center of local organization will be responsible for organizing visits to the airports of the cities concerned and contact the medical officers and teams on site, explain the system and provide them with lists of referral clinics.

16.10 Medical Staff NOCs

From August 13 to September 1, 2019, NOC doctors will be allowed to practice medicine and treat members of their delegations, provided they have applied for temporary registration and have been approved by the Moroccan authority. concerned. NOC doctors must send a copy of their medical diplomas in English, French or Portuguese only by 05 May 2019. On the email address : med@jar2019.ma

After the approval of the Moroccan authorities, the NOC doctors will be able to treat the members of their own delegations. NOC doctors may only issue prescriptions from the COJAR Medical Center. They may also treat members of other delegations with prior written permission.



16.11 Importation of drugs and medical equipment

The Moroccan authorities impose no restrictions on the importation of medicines for personal use (part of the accompanied baggage); it is therefore not necessary to declare them to the customs. Passengers traveling with their medications are advised to bring a valid prescription from a physician with them.

NOCs are requested to send a list of medicines and medical equipment for review by the Medical Services Team before 05 May at the Email address. 2019. The aim of this approach is to help the NOCs to identify drugs and medical equipment that may be subject to customs restrictions or may be illegal in Morocco.

Information on the importation of medicines and medical equipment by freight can be found in the Customs and Freight Section

16.12 Meetings of COJAR Team Doctors

On August 17, 2019, the opening meeting between COJA R and the team doctors will take place in the meeting room of Chefs de Mission. The NOCs will receive an invitation from COJAR as soon as they arrive at the accommodation sites. The purpose of this meeting is to inform the doctors of the NOC teams about the policies applicable to the African Games Rabat 2019.

16.13 Immunizations

There is no requirement for vaccination to enter Morocco, however NOCs are urged to take all necessary precautions and to consult their local doctor before traveling to ensure that all vaccines are up to date.

16.14 Public health services

Public health services, including disease control, communicable disease control and health protection (such as food and water) will be in place through the Moroccan Ministry of Health during the games.

Local hospitals have 24-hour emergency specialized services and tourist clinics are also available. Local pharmacies are present throughout the neighborhoods, and on-call pharmacies are open 24 hours a day.

Anti-Doping Control

17



The 2019 Rabat African Games will collect more than 500 urine and blood samples and a large percentage of pre-competition checks.

Key points :

- A distribution plan intelligent controls will focus both on the controls before the competition during the competition, based on risk assessments developed in collaboration with the agency Mondiale Doping (WADA) to ensure effective controls and coordinated
- The 2019 All Africa Games will implement the WADA Technical Document for Sport-Specific Analysis (TDSSA), which imposes minimum levels of analysis for certain types of prohibited substances. This may imply that athletes who are not used to blood collection will have to provide blood samples.

17.1 Anti-Doping Rules

The anti-doping rules applicable to the 2019 Rabat African Games approved in April 2019 are applicable to all athletes participating in the 2019 Rabat African Games.

All NOCs, athletes and support personnel athletes, including medical personnel, must read and become familiar with the anti-doping rules of the Games Ricans Af 2019, available on the website of the games.

Key points :

- Athletes can be controlled at any time and at any place under the authority of COJAR ;
- During the Games period, samples collected 12 hours prior to a competition at which an athlete is to participate, until the end of the competition (including the sample collection process related to that

competition), will be analyzed in light of substances banned during competition present on the list of prohibited substances 2019. All other samples will be analyzed in light of the permanent list of prohibited substances.

17.2 Rights and responsibilities of athletes during doping controls

A Doping Control Officer (DCO) or chaperone will warn athletes who have been selected for doping control. The athlete will be notified of the type of sample he will need to provide - urine and/or blood. They will also be informed of their rights and responsibilities during the doping control and will have to sign the notification. The rights and responsibilities of the athletes are as follows:

19.2.1 Rights

- Have a representative and, if necessary, an interpreter ;
- Request additional information on the sample collection process ;
- Request a delay in reporting to the Doping Control Station for valid reasons as determined by the DCO, such as receiving medical attention, taking part in a Victory Ceremony or completing commitments to the media ;
- Request changes in the sample collection process; for minor athletes.

17.2.2 Responsibilities

- Stay under constant supervision of the ACD/chaperone from the initial contact time with the DCO/chaperone until the end of the sample collection ;
- Provide appropriate identification, such as accreditation ;
- Adhere to sample collection procedures; any breach may constitute an anti-doping rule violation JA 2019;
- Go immediately to doping control, unless there are compelling reasons for delay.

19.3 Sample Analysis and Results Management

- The samples will be analyzed at the anti-doping laboratory in Lausanne, Switzerland, with a response time of 72 hours following their filing according to the convention established with the Regional Organization Anti Doping Africa Zone I (ORAD).
- The samples will be delivered to the laboratory by the International Transport DHL according to a memorandum of understanding.
- COJAR is responsible for receiving the results, in case of anti-doping rule violations, the results management will be entrusted to the athlete NADO, the African confederation concerned or the International Federation.
- In the event of an abnormal test result, COJAR will promptly inform the athlete, NOC, African Confederation, IF and WADA, and a temporary suspension may be imposed.
- The Athlete will have the right to have his B Sample analyzed, and will have the opportunity to participate in a hearing before the CAS Anti-Doping Division or to submit his defense in writing.

17.4 Exemptions for therapeutic use

Athletes wishing to use a prohibited substance or method during the games will need a Therapeutic Use Authorization (TUE), the application must be sent to COJAR before July 10, 2019 at the email address. : aut@jar2019.ma

If an athlete already has a TUE granted by their NADO, his African confederation or its IF and that was recorded in the system of Directors and management of doping (ADAMS), no further action is required.

If the athlete already has a TUE issued by an ADO that has not been registered in ADAMS, the TUE must be sent to the COJAR TUE Committee (TUEC) for recognition.

The COJAR TUEC may decide on the revision of a TUE. If the TUEC is of the opinion that a TUE does not meet international standards for Therapeutic Use Exemptions, it may refuse to recognize it, in which case it will immediately notify the Athlete and the NOC. The athlete may appeal the decision to not recognize a TUE exclusively from WADA.

If an athlete applies for a new TUE during the Games period due to a medical emergency or new treatment, the application must be sent to the COJAR TUEC.

All new TUEs must be submitted and reported via ADAMS, except in justified circumstances. In such cases, TUEs must be requested by fax, email, or on-site at the Games Medical Center.

A TUE issued by the COJAR TUEC will only be valid during the Games period, so all athletes must use their NADO/RADO, African Confederation or FI for any necessary TUEs outside of the Games period.

17.5 Athlete locations

The locations are part of the information provided by or for an athlete's account and define its location during the period of the games, in accordance with the COJAR Anti-Doping Rules.

NOCs will be required to provide a list of athletes' whereabouts outside the official accommodation site and athlete room lists at each accommodation site.

Athletes who are included in a registered target group must continue to indicate their locations during the game period in ADAMS or equivalent.

17.6 Operations during games

17.6.1 Transport

If an athlete requires transportation from a competition venue due to participation in a doping control, COJAR will provide a transfer to their hosting site, accompanied by an ACD or chaperone, if the process is not finished.

It is the responsibility of the NOCs to transport athletes not residing at the official accommodation site to their accommodation after the completion of a doping control.

17.6.2 Requests for checks

NOCs may request the collection of a sample to confirm a national record by presenting the Athlete at the Doping Control Station at the competition venue and submitting their request directly to the Doping Control Officer. The NOC will have to bear the costs of the sample analysis by completing an agreement form.

The costs will be paid directly to the laboratory.

More information will be communicated at the time of the games.

18.1 Insurance Coverage


Insurance policies taken by the COJAR cover all stakeholders and beneficiaries in the organization of the 12th Edition of the African Games in 2019 Rabat Morocco (athletes, team officials and any other categories of the family Games).

COJAR will provide medical coverage and damage resulting from an accident related to the 2019 All Africa Games. The organization will also take out liability insurance to cover any damage to third parties.

It is the responsibility of the NOCs to contract international travel insurance policies covering hospitalization and repatriation for all members of their delegations.

It is the responsibility of the NOCs to take out insurance policies covering their athletes « injuries and accidents That can occur during training and/or competitions.

20.2 Damage to property



COJAR will not be responsible for any loss or theft or damage to property and/or possessions of NOCs that have not been specifically placed under its supervision.

NOCs will be responsible for all damage to COJAR property, hotels, accommodation sites, competition and training venues, vehicles or other locations. They will have to carry out the relevant repairs in order to restore them to the condition where they were found or received. Repairs or replacement costs will be borne by the NOCs, even if they perform the repairs/replacements or not.

The 2019 Rabat African Games represent an opportunity to bring back a number of positive benefits or impacts to the city and its surroundings.

The vision of this heritage is divided into three axes:

20.1 Economic and occupational heritage:

The Games must allow certain activities to flourish and they must be considered as a platform for the projection of the territory: both to attract investments in the business community and the internationalization of the companies of the territory, as a tourist attraction. Its objectives are therefore as follows:

- Creation of direct jobs derived from investments in construction and services for the Games.
- Founded action of new jobs to direct the new spaces and sports facilities.
- Increasing the level of employment of workers and volunteers through the acquisition of skills and knowledge.
- Creation of commercial outlets and internalisation of enterprises.
- Improvement of the international positioning of the territory.
- Improvements in the hotel sector.
- Promotion of sports tourism.

20.2 Sport legacy

Rabat has a historic sporting tradition, with sports clubs and internationally recognized top athletes. The Games represent an opportunity to increase the quality of sport at all levels, with particular emphasis on promoting sport for all as a driver of social cohesion in the territory.

Its objectives are :

- More sports facilities and better quality, to ensure regional balance: facilities that are sustainable and adaptable to the needs of the local population.
- An increase in the sporting practice offering the possibility of strengthening the promotion of sport for children and repositioning physical exercise as a healthy practice.

20.3 Cultural heritage and for the community

This potential heritage, centered on social and cultural aspects, is an inherently intangible legacy that presents certain difficulties and challenges when it comes to evaluating them.

But these aspects are the key to a long-term Olympic footprint on the territory and in society, with:

- An increase in citizen participation and sports agents in the event and in the territory.
- The construction of models and practices of public/private collaboration on the territory.
- The stimulation of relations between the co-hosting cities of the Games.
- Training and consolidating a strong network of volunteers
- Teaching the values of sport, coexistence, health and education in the Mediterranean Basin to children and young people in the region.
- The cultural revitalization of the territory.

Athlete Guide for the African Games Rabat 2019

The athlete's charter during the medal ceremony:

- Be punctual at the medal ceremony;□
- Wear the official dress of his delegation (his country) and closed shoes;□
- sandals and shorts are forbidden;□
- Listening to the instructions of the person in charge and the hostesses;□
- Be respectful to dignitaries and other people involved;□
- Do not chew gum during the medal ceremony;□
- Do not use your cell phone during the ceremony.□
- In the event that the athlete is unable to receive his medal during the ceremony, he will report to the local protocol with an attendant to sign the necessary forms and receive the medal owed to him.□
- In case of refusal of the athlete, the discount is postponed after the settlement of the problem in the same day, depending on the availability of officials (commission or jury) On a subsequent day, according to the agreement between the person in charge of the presentation of the medals and the service of the Sports Programming.□

Rules of the delegations:

1. You must make sure you have your African Games accreditation card at all times. It allows you to eat for free at feeding sites, to be transported, to have access to accommodation and competition sites.
2. You are a representative of your country. You will have to wear your dress in the colors of the country and do honor to it by behaving appropriately and respectfully.
3. For the opening, closing and medal ceremonies, you will have to wear the dedicated dress (opening ceremony) and the country run, that is to say the dress in the colors of your country.
4. Any drug or alcoholic beverages are strictly forbidden at all times. An infraction of this regulation means a sanction of the person at fault or the delegation.
5. Each athlete must identify his sports equipment bag with the label provided by the African Games.

Transport

1. You will need to be transported to competitions venues and accommodation sites in buses / van or minibus both in and out.
2. All athletes MUST carry the coach / van / minibus at the time and place to be assigned.
3. When entering the bus, the user must present his or her accreditation card to the driver. Entrance must be exclusively through the front door of the bus.
4. The user must refrain from any disorder, offensive and vulgar language on the bus. He must also comply with the regulations in force on the bus. The user must converse discreetly, without shouting or site, and must not make use of noisy devices.
5. All drivers will respect the determined stops. No stops outside the specified locations will be made at the request of users, except in case of emergency.
6. It is strictly forbidden to smoke, drink or eat on buses.
7. The user is responsible for transporting his personal belongings.

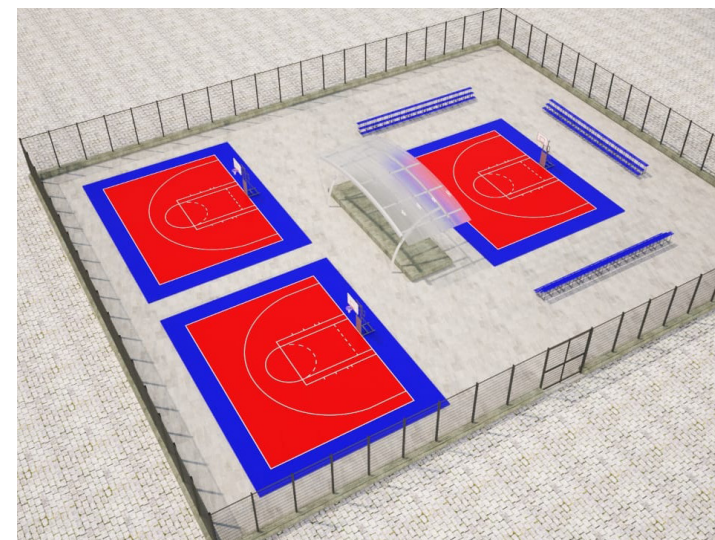
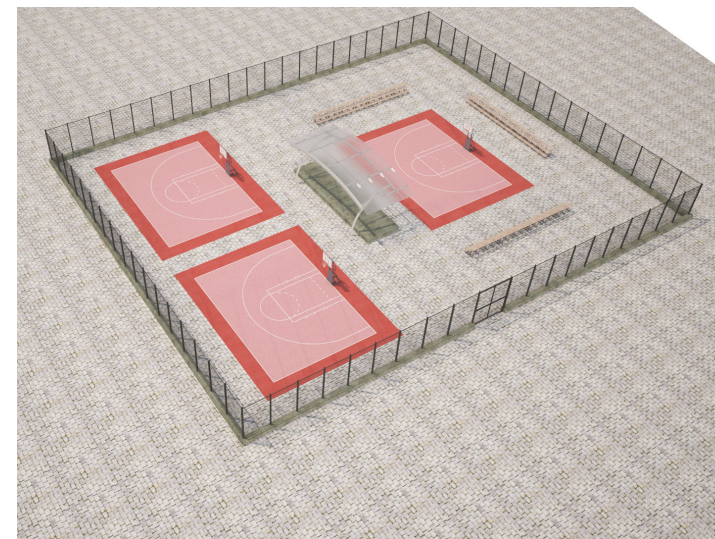
Accommodation

1. You will always have to stay with the delegation and stay in the village of the African games;
2. Only accredited persons will be admitted to the accommodation website. The accreditation card is mandatory.
3. The security guard of the accommodation will remove the accreditation card from the athlete who shows up after the closing of the village (... H)
4. After the closure of the African village, no athlete is allowed to leave his accommodation site alone. Exceptionally, if an athlete is absent from his accommodation site outside the scheduled hours, he must have received the authorization of his head of delegation and be accompanied by a manager;
5. It is strictly forbidden to change rooms during the night, the board of accommodation must be informed to transmit the change of location to the anti-doping commission;
6. It is forbidden to drink or eat in the rooms (the athlete who wants to eat may do so in a specific place). It is strictly forbidden to smoke on the accommodation sites and on the competition and training sites;
7. Supervision of athletes at the accommodation sites is provided first by the coaches, chaperones, and then by the chiefs and delegations;
8. Scrambling, and games with all kinds of objects (including balloons) are prohibited in homesteads and circulation areas within the African Games Village;
9. Access to the Volunteer Spaces and the Heads of Mission Meeting Room is prohibited for athletes.
10. Entrances, exits and movements in general are made only through the routes and doors assigned for this purpose.
11. If an athlete from a delegation is found responsible for theft, breakage of equipment or other serious misdemeanors, the site responder immediately notifies the security sector and the head of delegation.
12. The security of valuables is the responsibility of everyone. At the end of the Final, the unclaimed found objects will be transferred to a dedicated space (find objects), which will keep them for the period of the games.
13. All athletes must respect the rest of others.
14. Athletes must take care of the equipment and respect the volunteers at the accommodation sites, by being civic and courteous.
15. Delegations must respect the timing of the release of accommodation;
16. Baggage must be stored in the area identified by the site manager, to facilitate transportation to dedicated vehicles;
17. The cell phones must be in silent mode between 00:00 and 07:00 and they should not be used during the sleep period except for the light to facilitate movement to the bathroom.
18. A coach / coach per discipline is responsible for the awakening of athletes from his discipline in his country. He is the only one authorized to set an alarm for the awakening of the athletes.
19. Wearing pajamas, high and low, is mandatory in the accommodation zone.
