OVERALL RANKING : EGYPT GRABS 20 MEDALS IN THE SAME SINGLE DAY !

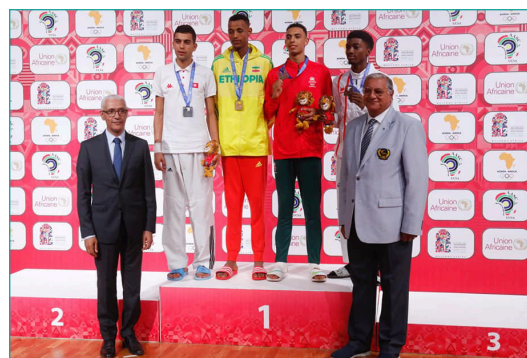
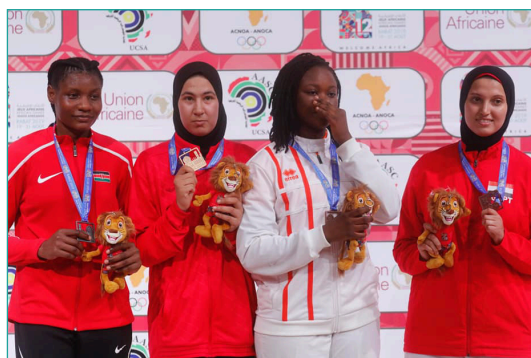
Egypt continues to widen the gap in the overall ranking of the All-Africa Games 12th edition. Yesterday, 20 of its champions have reached the podium, bringing its score to 50 medals, including 14 gold 20 silver and 16 bronze.

South Africa overtook Algeria and moves to the second place with 27 medals (12 gold 9 silver and 6 bronze). Algeria,

relegated to the third place, obtained, at the end of the third day of the competition, 30 medals (10 or 8 silver and 12 bronze).

For its part, Morocco maintained its ranking in the fourth place with 27 medals including 8 or 9 silver and 10 bronze.

SOUTH AFRICA DOMINATES THE SWIMMING EVENTS

5 gold, 3 silver and 4 bronze medals. With such a score, South Africa dominated the swimming tournaments held at the Casablanca Olympic swimming pool, during the third day of the All-Africa Games 12th edition. The rainbow nation is followed by Egypt, which has won 4 gold, 5 silver and 2 bronze medals. Algeria, in

third place, is far behind with a single gold medal, 1 silver and 4 bronze, while the host country, Morocco is fourth with two medals, 1 gold and 1 Silver. Swimming tournaments continue until August 24th.





TAEKWONDO: IVORY COAST AND MOROCCO SHARE THE LEADING POSITION

With 3 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze medals each, the Moroccan and Ivorian taekwondo athletes brought their respective countries tremendous pride and honour in the competition tournaments. At the end of the second day of Taekwondo, the two countries share the first place in the overall ranking. Egypt follows closely with 2 gold, 4 silver and a bronze medal.

Thursday was marked by the victory of Sahib Soukaina (Morocco) on Tau Michelle

(Lesotho) on the score of 10-6 in the final of -46 kg category. In the -53 kg category, the victory and Gold Medal went to Nwosu Chinazum Ruth (Nigeria) at the detriment of Oumaima El Bouchti (Morocco) who had to settle for silver medal. On Wednesday, the defending African champion in the -80 kg category, Cisse Cheikh (Ivory Coast) won the gold medal after his victory against Ashraf Mahboubi (Morocco).
